Admissions

Key Stage 4 (Years 10-11)

As students progress to Key Stage 4, we will continue to offer a broad and balanced curriculum. Our specialism in science, technology, engineering and mathematics, will enable us to offer additional opportunities to our students including:

- Specialist Science and Mathematics Courses: GCSE courses in physics, chemistry, biology, and mathematics will be offered and will be tailored to challenge, and will inspire students who exhibit a keen interest and aptitude in these areas.
- Technology and Engineering Pathways: Students will choose specialised pathways in technology and engineering, delving into advanced topics like computer science, electronics, and advanced engineering principles.
- Preparation for Further Education and Careers: We will provide guidance and support for students considering higher education or careers in STEM fields, including mentorship, work experience opportunities, and college/career readiness programs.
